Proposals for Changes IISHF Constitution / IISHF Regulations

Dear IISHF Presidium,

in regard to IISHF Communication Letter 2017-22 ISHD would like to submit the following proposals for further discussion with all NGBs.

§ 11.6 Constitution – Changes of Constitution

It has been recently decided by the AGM that changes to the IISHF Rules Book can only be done in each even year any rule change and in each odd year only clarification and any error bux fixings. We propose to implement the same structure also to IISHF Constitution and propose the following.

Changes to IISHF Constitution can only be done

- *in each odd year any constitution change*
- *in each even year only clarification and any error corrections*

As consequence each year we could have major changes either only on the IISHF Rules Book or only on the IISHF Constitution and would save a lot of time at each AGM.

§ 11.7 Regulations – New Procedure for changes of Regulations

This year we implemented a new procedure for proposals to change the IISHF Rules Book. This new procedure saves us a lot of time on the Working Meeting and General Meeting as the proposals have been previously discussed by the relevant experts of each NGB.

We propose to implement a similar procedure also for IISHF Regulations.

At the moment we lose much time on our annual meetings to discuss the relevant proposals and we could use this time much more better for other items e.g. development of our sport. It is much more productive if the relevant proposals shall be also discussed prior to the AGM by the experts of each NGB.



§ 11.6 + § 11.7 Constitution – Deadline for proposals

When the before listed proposal "Regulations – New Procedure for changes of Regulations" will not be taken, then we have the following idea.

Currently all proposals for changes to IISHF Constitution and IISHF Regulations shall be submitted to IISHF Presidium no later than 3 weeks prior to the General Meeting and IISHF Presidium then shall circulate these proposals to the NGBs no later than 2 weeks prior to the General meeting.

We propose to change the submission limit from 3 weeks to 8 weeks and the circulation limit from 2 weeks to 6 weeks.

Thus the NGBs would have much more time (6 weeks instead of 2 weeks) to discuss this topic within their NGB and to deal with and would be better prepared at the AGM.

§ 11.7 Constitution – Alteration of proposals

Due to the current status during a general meeting new proposals for Changes to the Regulations can be altered by the applicant before being vote upon unless withdrawn by the applicant. Due to the experiences during several AGMs there was often confusion about alterations who was responsible to finalize the alterations and to provide to the Council of Members. We think it should be made clear who has to fix/provide the alteration and to think about a deadline and summarized make the following proposal:

During a General Meeting new proposals for Changes to the Regulations can only be altered by the applicant by providing the alteration before the start of the General Meeting with full new wording by email to IISHF Presidium and all NGBs taking part at this AGM.

Regulations (new paragraph) – Damages to Property

In the previous years during title events damages to property have been deliberately caused by players of teams. At some locations the infrastructure of halls has been damaged by intention and the hosting club may lose the future use of the hall. Thus we propose the following action:

- *Full Implementation in TD Report and recommendation/instruction to IISHF Disciplinary Committee to sanction/punish the incidents/damages more severely*
- *Provide a small fund for all hosts of title events to compensate damages which have not been demonstrably settled by anybody else*

Regulations (new paragraph) – Abuse of accreditation cards

Due to common practise the hosts provides accreditation cards to all players to enter the dressing room area as well as the spectators area. But unfortunately players from some teams have handed over their accreditation cards to friends or family members that these other people get free access at title events. This is not only fraud and a breach of sportsmanship, but this is also very unfair behaviour towards the host. Thus we propose to implement the following procedure:

- *Any player who has lost his accreditation card has to pay the full amount of entrance fees for the all days event to the host to get a new accreditation card.*
- *Any person who uses the accreditation card from another person will be immediately suspended from the remainder of the event. Further IISHF Disciplinary Action is possible – this disciplinary action could be e.g. 100 EUR fixed fine to make the proceeding easy as possible.*



Regulations (new paragraph) – Players on ITC

Some teams have put the same person on an ITC as player and as official to get two accreditation cards instead of one. Thus we propose to implement a regulation that on the ITC each person can only be listed once.
